# Seven Deadly Sins Sidebar: What's Wrong with Cohabitation Anyway?

October marks the 500th anniversary of the Christian Reformation. Even secular historians agree that one of the main accomplishments of Martin Luther in his lifetime was unifying the German language. He accomplished that by translating the Latin Bible into the German language as we have it today. In doing so, he unified the many different dialects of German into a common language. This also accomplished a dream of Martin Luther's…getting God's word into the hands of God's people. Up to that point, only the educated priests had access to the Bible. As we celebrate the work the Lord accomplished through Marin Luther, we can thank the Lord for the precious gift of his word in our lives.

Our present and upcoming Bible Studies are ways to continue to make God's word a part of our daily lives. Last month, we began a new Bible study called The Seven Deadly Sins. Each week we look at what God's Word has to say about a particular sin, why it's deadly, how Christ defeated it on our behalf, and how to combat it in our daily lives. This month, we are sharing in greater detail a vignette from the lesson on Lust. The vignette is specifically about cohabitation, the sadly common practice of a couple living together before they are married.

Scripture does not specifically say anything about living together before marriage. That's not to say Scripture doesn't speak "to" the issue. What God does tell us are harmful to body and soul and marriage (and therefore sinful) are lust and sexual immorality. Our good God wants sex reserved for marriage. God's Sixth Commandment is not about "spoiling our fun." Rather, it's about preventing us

from spoiling our relationships and our souls. Much more could be said on this, but recent studies have shown the damaging effects pornography and other sexual sins have on a person, how they "hijack" the brain. (For more on this, search the web for a book called Wired For Intimacy.)

When it comes to cohabitation, some might argue that they could live with a significant other before marriage while still abstaining from sex—that the sex part is the only "sin" part. Sadly, this is a very short-sighted view of sin and repentance.

Here are three reasons why cohabitation before marriage is sinful and harmful, even if the couple is not engaging in premarital sex:

Cohabitation is putting yourself in a position to be constantly under temptation, instead of "fleeing" it. And are you really able to resist?

Why is flirting with temptation so bad? To put it bluntly, sin left unchecked leads to impenitence (unrepentance), which means no faith, which means no salvation. Taking sin lightly is a very dangerous pattern. Jesus would have us take sin seriously and conduct

"spiritual surgery" to remove anything from our lives that tempts us toward sin. God's Word bids us:

- "Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart" (2 Timothy 2:22).
- "And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. It is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell" (Mark 9:47).

#### Cohabitation is giving a poor witness to non-Christians.

Unbelievers who see two Christians living together will assume they are engaging in premarital sex and draw the conclusion that sin must not be a big deal for Christians and thus, "maybe my sins aren't a big deal either." That tragic false impression waters down God's law and therefore the need for God's gospel.

Instead, God would have our lives, "make the teaching about God our Savior attractive" (Titus 2:10). Are two people living

> together striving in their "new self" to live out Christ's calling to them as in these verses?

- "But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, or of greed, because these are improper for God's holy people" (Ephesians 5:3).
- · "Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us" (1 Peter 2:12).
- "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

"And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again... Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:15, 17)

- "If anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to be thrown into the sea with a large millstone tied around his neck" (Mark 9:42).
- "Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause him to fall" (1 Corinthians 8:13).

Jesus didn't take sin lightly. He took it so seriously he spent 33 years as our stand-in, living, suffering and finally dying for every sin he took so seriously. Now through faith, we are a new creation in him who lived and died for us. May our lives of repentant faith demonstrate our love for Christ and our love for our neighbor. And may we speak the truth in love to those caught in the snare of cohabitation.

## A Journey for Cruz de Cristo, Mahahual Mexico

My journey to Mahahual, Mexico started in a most unexpected place...praying beside a stream on the Tibetan Plateau. While traveling to a remote school there for a documentary film project, my team became stranded for hours while the road in front of us was literally being finished. With no where to go, and no distractions, I sat and prayed more intently and peacefully than at any time in my life. I asked the Lord to provide an opportunity to travel and serve His Church in a similar manner. And this is how I found myself, two years later, making the four hour drive south of Cancun to Costa Maya Ministries in Mahahual.

I met up with Pastor Martin Valleskey at Iglesia Cruz de Cristo, Cross of Christ church, and we headed to Pulticub, a mission outpost in a fishing community 50 kilometers up the coast. As pavement gave way to dirt roads, and dirt roads to a sandy trail, I was struck by the effort that goes into the mission work here. This is Jesus' Great Commission in

living, breathing form. Over 5 million people live in the three Mexican states that make up the Yucatan Peninsula...Cruz de Cristo is the only Lutheran church there and is one of the few churches of any denomination functioning on a daily basis. While the preconception is that Mexicans are devote Catholics, the truth is, at least in this area, that most are unchurched or disconnected from their faith. As we dodge potholes that threaten to swallow our tires, we honestly don't know if anyone will be waiting when we arrive. But faith comes by hearing, and with so few opportunities to do so, keeping these people connected to Word means making the drive. We are blessed to find two families for Bible study.

Upon returning to Mahahual, we meet a woman with a request. Her daughter is pregnant and needs to see a doctor, could they borrow Pastor's car to get her there? Pastor agrees. The hospital is a half day's drive away and he doesn't know when the vehicle will return. It doesn't seem to





matter. If he can help, he does. Born to missionary parents in Africa, Pastor Valleskey's heart lies in outreach. Lending his car, driving the extra kilometers, sharing his food or comforting words, if there is an opportunity to demonstrate the love of Christ, he does so without hesitation. He is self sufficient, thoughtful, humble, resolved...blessings that steel him as currently the only called worker on the ground in Mahahual. But he certainly is not alone in his efforts.

Deb Blackburn, a North Carolinian by birth, is the local ministry coordinator for Costa Maya Ministries, a gracious woman whose energy is as boundless as her love for Christ. Working in mysterious ways, God used Hurricane Dean to help Deb meet Lynn and Jerry Zimpelmann and in turn bring Deb to faith. The Zimpelmanns, Wisconsin residents and missionaries in their own right, had nearly completed their dream retirement home on a beach near Mahahual when the Category 5 storm Dean pummeled the area. Needing a place to stay, Deb and her husband Hugh parked their RV on the Zimpelmann's property and helped with the rebuild. The Zimpelmanns held Bible studies with Deb who in time came to faith, and the seeds of Costa Maya Ministries were planted. Mysterious ways indeed!

I joined Deb in picking up kids in the "Kilometer 55" neighborhood, a place of relative poverty. Standing outside the van as Deb honked the horn, I would hear the sound of feet pounding the ground as kids came running from all directions, eager for English lessons and art projects, for the soup kitchen and Bible study. Deb smiles as she mentions they had "37 kids in this van at one time." The message is clear, the ground here is fertile for spreading the Word.

A great deal of my time in Mahahual was spent interviewing members of the church, many in their native Spanish. Working with Pastor to translate my questions, we asked them to share their story of faith. While I have some understanding of Spanish, I'm far from fluent. However, their physical responses bridged the language barrier in a way that mere words could not. Unbridled joy shown on their faces and through their body language as they spoke about

the power of the Gospel coming into their lives. As someone blessed to be raised in a Christian household from birth, "hearing" this testimony was rare, raw and inspiring.

Sunday morning comes and Iglesia Cruz de Cristo is abuzz with activity. Children set up chairs. Volunteers from the States make new acquaintances. Kids pour in from the vans outside. The service begins and songs of praise echo into "Casitas" or "little houses" neighborhood where the church resides. Yallo, a man with a weathered face and eyes of deep compassion, stands to read a scripture lesson, sharing the Word with his fellow Mexicans. This is critical. The mission, built by the tireless efforts of Jerry Zimpelmann and countless volunteers, now needs the people it serves to take ownership, to make it their church, to spread the joy they've found whenever they go. Watching Yallo as he read, face beaming with pride, there is no doubt strong roots are taking hold.

I think often of our brothers and sisters in Mahahual, of Yallo, Don Santos, Pedro, Balta, Ruby, Miguel and Remedios, of Deb Blackburn and Pastor Valleskey, of the volunteers who so gracious give their time both here in the United States and in Mexico in support of the mission. I pray for the Lord's continued blessings, but far to often, I need to remind myself to refold my hands and pray not only for this mission, but for those through the world. Places like Mahahual are indeed the "ends of the earth" where people have not heard of Jesus. They all need our prayers, I ask that you join me in remembering them in yours as well.

The mission in Mahahual was self-started. It hasn't received any synod funding and is flourishing by the support and donations of volunteers. ## **UPDATE:** Crown of Life & Community Deliverance Church

What following are questions members have asked since last months newsletter issue. If you have more questions, Please direct them to Pastor Pudlo.

#### What's the progress been with the partner ministry since this Summer's voter's meeting?

Lots. First, I've (Pastor Pudlo) been in contact with the synod as to some of the following steps to take. I have been given a curriculum to use in my continued meetings with Pastor Baion. The curriculum is the same curriculum that is used to train second career men to become pastors in the WELS and is called the PSI (Pastoral Studies Institute). I will be going through this curriculum with Pastor Baion in the meantime. Second, Pastor Baion and I have shared our respective church calendars with one another for communication's sake. I have invited their church to participate in all our fellowship and outreach events. They have inquired about getting involved in some of the upkeep of the building and facilities as well.

#### Is this a distraction from our current ministry?

The voter's certainly don't think so. As a congregation we have been discussing how it is we can do more multicultural ministry at each location. This partnership seems to be a way the Lord is answering that very question. The partnership provides an opportunity for us to reach more and more people with the gospel in a way that we probably couldn't reach them without the partnership.

#### Where is this partnership going?

The short answer is "Only God knows." The longer answer is a bit more complicated. As I spoke with one of the WELS synodical leaders, he mentioned the possibility of this going right back to Sierra Leone, the home country of the leaders of Community Deliverance Church. His point was that we could end up training this church and they may end up taking their training back to Africa in order to contribute to the mission work already being done there. Talk about dreaming big! However, with Christianity on pace to nearly double in Africa from 2000 to 2025, it seems like the field is ripe across the Atlantic and this isn't beyond the realm of possibility.


## "Jesus Among Secular Gods: The Countercultural Claims of Christ"

That means that although our society bases many of its morals on Christian groundwork, it has rejected and/or forgotten the religious beliefs of Christianity. In the place of God, many people have set up secular gods. In Jesus Among Secular Gods, Ravi Zacharias and Vince Vitale explore the claims of all these secular beliefs such as Atheism, Scientism, Hedonism and more. This book not only gives Christians some good thoughts about why the arguments for secular gods are weak, but it also gives those curious about Christianity solid evidence as to why they should check out the claims of Christianity.



While there are challenging sections to this book, there are also very good illustrations that explain deeper concepts of secular beliefs and why they have poor foundations. I would recommend this book to people who interact with secular Americans on a regular basis as a way to help them think through ways to communicate the truths of Christianity and the lies of secular beliefs.
