
Dear Graduate...

Dear Graduate, Pastor Kom was really busy this month so he asked me to write you a letter in place of his newsletter article. He suggested that I give you some advice for the future as you are now graduating. I couldn't turn Pastor Kom down (we're pretty close), so here we go....

I suppose you might wonder why he would ask me to write you a letter in the first place, right? It's because I wrote Psalm 119 in the bible. There's so much in there to provide solid, godly advice for your future now that you have "walked across the stage." For today, though, I just wanted to focus you on three verses.

Graduation really begins with a question – a question that you must ask yourself every day for the rest of your life. It doesn't matter if you're graduating and looking for a job or if you're graduating and moving on to high school. As a child of God, you must always ask the question that I phrased in v.9 of my psalm: how can a young man keep his way pure? It applies to all of us, doesn't it? Men, women, girls and boys – the constant struggle is to keep our way pure, to stay faithful to the Lord regardless of what may come.

That may sound rather obvious, right? But just think of what you're up against! High School brings its own set of temptations and challenges. You are entering a world where trying new things and "expanding your horizons" is the rule, not the exception. Trying new things can be quite a blessing, but trying sinful new things because everybody else is doing it can destroy your faith. There are countless young people who slide away from the Lord in four short years because they couldn't handle the temptations and the "new" things that their friends were doing.



Of course, it's just as challenging if you are entering college or the work force. There is a "freedom" to be enjoyed now that you are on your own. Making decisions without mom and dad looking over your shoulder, doing things the way you'd like to do them is an exciting proposition. But Satan often uses that against you. Mom and dad always made you go to church. Now you're on your own. If you want to stay out late and have a party with your friends or coworkers – no problem. You're the boss of you. Your worship life easily begins to slide and fade. "Independent" you creates new habits and different priorities. Satan's trap worked.

Do you begin to see why I raised the all-important question? It's a constant struggle to keep yourself on the right path, bound for heaven when all of those other distractions and temptations attack you nearly every day.

Thankfully, graduate, I provided the solution to all of this in those few verses of my Psalm. I said, by living according to your word. I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.

Advise on How to Remain Close to the Lord

Pray Often

My psalm says to seek the Lord with all your heart. So seek him in prayer! Set up a regular schedule for when you want to have that heart to heart talk with our one, true God. He stands ready to help you. Jesus was tempted, too! He will help provide the strength that you need to withstand those temptations that will surely come your way.

Seek the help of other Christians

The heart of a child of God never wants to stray from the Lord. That's what our "new self" always desires. So find ways to "keep yourself in check" and to also have some accountability in your life so that someone is asking questions if you begin to stray. In the past your parents always fulfilled that role. But now, graduate, it's time to step up and take some initiative in that area for yourself! Be a "regular" at a bible study where other Christians will get to know you to support you and encourage you

in your walk with the Lord, but also to call you back when you're missed from their fellowship! You can even provide the same Christian service to them. Help each other along the way to heaven.

Have Personal Devotions Regularly

The Psalm said that I hid the Word of God in my heart so that I wouldn't sin. Do you know how that Word gets planted in someone's heart? You have to have contact with that Word. You need to study it and think about it!

That's why it's so important to read and study the bible on your own. If you don't know where to start, ask your Pastors for some help and guidance. There's even a daily bible reading schedule they could provide for you so that you wouldn't even have to stress over where to begin and what to read – and you'd cover the whole bible in a reasonable amount of time!

As you study the Word, the Holy Spirit will fill you up with a stronger faith and you will be more inclined to withstand temptations when they come. God's Word planted in you will be a powerful tool to draw on when temptations come!

Congratulations again, Graduate. I'm glad that you are now moving on to the next adventure of your life. Just remember to take the Lord with you and follow that advice that I laid out for you in Psalm 119.

a regular diet of God's word in your daily life. This is not always easy, especially with the irregular schedule now that school is out and the potential for travel.


If you have young children, or even if you enjoy looking at illustrated books as much as I do, you might find an illustrated bible to be nice for a change of pace. There are many of these simplified bibles available and it can be fun to see which bible stories are included and how the characters and events are depicted. Comparing the text with your regular bible's translation can be interesting to see how the message is communicated in similar yet different ways. Well known illustrators like

Tomie de Paola and Jan Brett have beautifully illustrated bible stories and books and Zondervan Publishing House has produced a very nice Bible for children via their

publishing arm Zonderkidz. There are several comic book styled illustrated bibles as well and these tap into

> the interests and imaginations of older children and adults as well.

The second suggestion involves the use of Luther's Catechism. If you have one from your own confirmation or if you have a child who has taken confirmation classes, make use of this book as a reference tool and study guide it was meant to be. Review important fundamental truths of the Christian faith and where they are found in scripture. This process not only reinforces your own faith but prepares you to share what you believe with others who have questions. How would you answer the following questions and can you support your answer from what God says in his word? How do we know there is a God? (p. 26) What is marriage according to God's word ? (p. 93) Why do we baptize little children? (p. 234) I pray that through your efforts God grant you new wisdom, insight and understanding into his word where he reveals who his is and the great things he has done for you and for all people.

ASK THE PASTOR

In Acts 1:1 it begins, "In my former book, Theophilus..." What book is he referring to? Why is this not in the BIble? Have you read it?

Luke is the author of the book of Acts. It seems like he wrote Acts as an addendum to his first book. Luke. There isn't a book called Theophilus. Luke is actually writing to a man named Theophilus. Here are some interesting notes about this Luke's books: 1) Luke wasn't one of the original 12 Apostles. He was a doctor and a traveling companion with Paul. So how did he write all about Jesus if he wasn't there? Luke tells us just how in the beginning of his first book. "I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught." Luke was not just a doctor, he was an investigator. He tracked down eyewitnesses of Jesus to describe for us the details of Jesus life. This isn't a myth. This is recorded history! 2) Just as Luke was written to tell about the life of Jesus, Luke also gives us the theme of Acts in Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power

when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The theme is the spread of the God's word to the ends of the earth through the power of the Holy Spirit in the disciples of Jesus. You have the Holy Spirit living in you through faith. You too share God's word. You too are written into the theme of this book!

Bach composed hundreds of musical pieces specifically for Lutheran Church services. Why do we no longer use them?

Bach, a Lutheran, did create a ridiculous number of musical pieces for worship. We still use a handful of them in our red hymnal. However, worship 300 years ago is slightly different than worship today. It might be difficult to use some of his pieces simply because of their length. Sometimes our choir will use partial arrangements of his cantatas. There are number of other factors that go into the reason for not using more of Bach's music, but the simplest answer is probably that not many of his pieces would fit well into one of our worship services. I will do some more digging into finding more arrangements that we can use in our worship services.

TREASURER – Fiscal Year 7/1 to 6/16

April ended the fiscal year to date (FYTD) with \$1,310,363 in total income with expected budget income to be \$1,316,633 (\$6,270 below budget). Expenses (FYTD) were \$1,284,926 which gave us a FYTD of a positive \$31,707. We paid back \$35,000 so owe \$16,621 to our special funds account.
