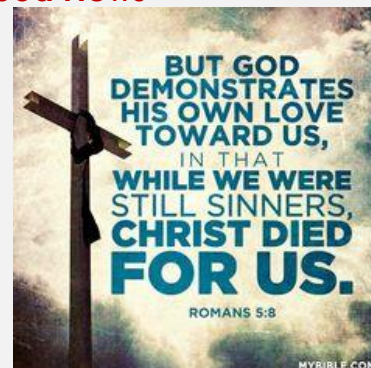

TRACK - Track practice will begin TODAY (Thursday, March 28) at Crown of Life. This will be a shortened practice (3:30 – 4:30) as it will be used to introduce the track season, go over any preliminary procedures and expectations, and to begin with some basic conditioning. Regular track practice will begin next week Tuesday (April 2). Those practices will be held at St. Croix from 3:30 – 5:00. St. Croix will provide a bus to transport the track athletes from COL to St. Croix for practice. Parents are to pick up their child from St. Croix after practice at 5pm. The first meet for grades 5-8 will be on Thursday, April 11 at Fridley. Track athletes should get in the habit of checking the weather forecast before each practice and meet.

4th grade students will have the opportunity to participate in track by attending 3 practices starting the last week after Easter and competing in the Lutheran Grade School Track Meet held at St. Croix on Friday, May 3.

BOWLING – The bowling season officially started with practices this past Monday. Practices will continue every Monday and Tuesday at Concord Lanes from 3:30 – 5:00 throughout the remainder of the season. The schedule of meets has yet to be published. As soon as it is, an updated sports calendar will be sent home.

Bowling shirts will be ordered for those who need one. We will use last year's shirt design. If your bowling jersey/shirt doesn't fit or is lost please inform Mr. Ohm and a new one will need to be ordered. Also, for any new bowlers on the team, a bowling shirt will need to be ordered (cost is \$20). It will have a number (of the bowler's choosing) and also their name on the back of the shirt. This shirt will be used as the COL bowling team jersey.

SPRING MULTI-SPORT ATHLETES – As the bowling and track seasons are lined up, the goal is always to avoid overlap as much as possible in order to give students the opportunity to participate in both sports if they choose. Be aware that doing this does place a heavier extra-curricular schedule on top of the normal school work load of the student. From past experiences we have learned that having all the track athletes at track practice is a must. There is usually one practice a week before a meet and in that practice the athletes are assigned their events for the upcoming meet. Missing a practice will impact the athlete and the team as they prepare for their events, especially any team relay races. The expectation is that any multi-sport athlete will attend every track practice and on the off track days would attend the bowling practices. Track meets and bowling meets never conflict so the athlete doesn't have to worry about overlap with meets.
