Leadership Is Influence

"I don't really consider myself a leader. I don't do much 'leading' of others." Have you ever thought that? I know I have. Here at Crown of Life we've been talking a lot about how everyone is a leader in some way or another. If you still need more convincing, consider this. Leadership expert John C. Maxwell has said, "Leadership is influence, nothing more, nothing less." The quotation has stuck with me ever since I heard it earlier this summer at the WELS Ed-Tech-Lead Summit. If leadership is influence, then we're all leaders to the extent that we have influence on others!

It reminds me also of a buzz word I keep hearing lately: "Influencer." "Influencer Marketing" is when marketing resources are focused not so much on the target market but on people who have influence over those in the target market. For example, a celebrity talking about their Nikes in a social media post will sell more Nike shoes than Nike's own social media pages. It's really just good old "word of mouth" marketing, isn't it? And when a celebrity-influencer's "word of mouth" can reach thousands or even millions of their followers instantaneously, that's influence!

Call it influence; call it leadership; leadership is influence, nothing more, nothing less.

No matter how many "followers" or "friends" you have on social media, no matter what leadership positions you hold, if any, you have influence—you are a leader. You can influence your peers and friends, your coworkers and acquaintances, your family and neighbors. And influence is what Jesus has called his followers to in this world.

"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Just like people often feel like they're not much of a leader, many people also feel like they don't have much influence on others either. Both are untrue. We all have influence! We're all leaders! Our influence on others may not feel very strong, but who says it has to be? Actually, in God's world, this is his favorite way to operate. He loves to influence the world through the seemingly uninfluential!

"Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were *influential*; not many were of noble birth. 27 But God chose the *foolish* things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the *weak* things of the world to shame the strong. 28 God chose the *lowly* things of this world and the *despised* things—and the *things that are not*—to nullify the things that are" (1 Corinthians 1:26-28).

Jesus himself is the ultimate example of this—the foolish, weak, lowly, and despised man who redeemed the world by his foolish, weak, lowly, and despised death. Not only that, but Jesus' lowly Word & Sacraments don't really seem like much on the outside, but what great influence he has on us through them!

And now God wants to operate that way through you in our own "circles of influence"! I'm sure you can think of any number of ways you can be a positive influence on others, but let's in at least a small way put a face on it.

- What influence it would have on a guest at on of our campuses to get a genuine smile and "good morning"—or a dozen of them!
- What influence it would have to turn off our screens and give even a short time of our undivided attention to our most nearby neighbors—our family!
- What *influence* it would have to consciously do at least one thing every day that would speak to your significant other's love language!
- What influence it would have if "everyone had one"—that is, if every member of our church had even one small way to be actively involved in our ministry!
- What influence it would have to pray daily for those in your life who don't know Christ!
- What influence it could have on them and you to make even a short list of ways you could be a positive spiritual influence on them!

How you influence others is not really as important as first knowing that you *can*, and secondly, being open to being used by your Savior. What happens after that will come naturally. We often will not know the influence we're having on others, but know that you are an influencer. You are a leader. So, continue to be influenced by Jesus and his Word to be an influencer.

Becoming Workers in the Harvest - Stewardship Thought

Scripture Reading: "Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field" (Matthew 9:35-38).

Jesus knew that the people needed a shepherd. He was determined to rescue as many as possible. Jesus said to His disciples, as He speaks to us, "Ask the Lord of harvest...to send out workers into His harvest field." It is God's will that all people come to salvation (2 Peter 3:9). The harvest field belongs to the Lord, and God will see that the people needed for the harvest will be available.

God invites all of us to be His workers in the harvest field. He doesn't need us, but He gives us the privilege to be involved

in this very important work. In His sovereignty, God has called and chosen to work through us. What we can offer is our time and our talents. In Christ, we can do work that will be blessed into eternity. We begin this all-important work by asking or praying for a successful harvest with many workers being sent into the harvest field. Because of our prayers, He will provide the workers who are needed.

As we pray for God's work to be accomplished through workers in the field, we are, in essence, allowing Him to make us the answers to our own prayers. God will find ways to use our gifts in ways that will touch others. We are encouraged to pray for God's work to be done, and to be involved in doing this work personally. God will give us the strength to overcome the excuses that often plague us such as I don't have the time or I'm not equipped. As Paul wrote, "I can do everything through Him Who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13).

Birth – 1 year



Beyond Identity

In *Beyond Identity*, Dick Keyes explores why it is so many people struggle to find meaning and purpose in their lives. This is a topic that many have wrestled with more and more over the past 50 + years. As a graduate of Harvard University and Westminster Theological Seminary, Keyes brings a Biblical perspective on a topic that has been traditionally viewed from a psychological perspective. Keyes uses many Biblical references in making his case that a person finds ultimate meaning and purpose in life only when they find their meaning and purpose in their relationship with God.



Keyes is a highly educated man and his writings reflect that. It wasn't the fastest read for me, because I had to stop at moments to understand what he was saying. While it was a slower read, I still found it quite beneficial and meaningful.

Community Service Project

The news is spreading that we at Crown of Life are doing a new community service project this summer. The Evangelism Committee has approved running a school supply drive to collect and donate supplies for the students attending Jackson Elementary School in St. Paul. Since this is a brand-new project, the following is some information about the drive that can answer some questions you might have about it.

Why a school supply drive?

In April, Matt Otterstatter, on behalf of the Evangelism Committee, wrote an article in the COL monthly newsletter. In it, he encouraged members to brainstorm ideas for service projects that benefited the community without necessarily expecting anything in return. Such service is often more compelling to those receiving the support because they see that we do not directly benefit from helping them. Even if the families we help do not end up coming to COL, the project will provide help for children in need, which may even positively impact our church's reputation in the community. This can be a catalyst for other great projects.

Why Jackson Elementary?

Certain areas in St. Paul have a higher number of families living in poverty. Minnesota Census and St. Paul Public School statistics show that 26% of households in the area served by Jackson Elementary have

level. Yes, the school receives state funding and some additional aid, but the children who attend the school do not. Our supply drive intends to assist these families and children, giving them a better chance at success at school.

Jesus commanded his disciples to go out into all the world to preach the gospel. In the same way, he wants us to shine our lights for him in any way so that the seeds of faith might be sewn everywhere. Perhaps we/COL will not be the ones to harvest what grows from these seeds, but it is our joyful duty to share God's love with all people, and we can rejoice if even one soul is saved.

How can I participate?

A specific, grade-by-grade school supply list can be found on the Crown of Life website. Students generally need glue sticks, 24-count boxes of crayons, boxes of tissues, No. 2 pencils, washable markers, colored pencils, pocket folders, wide ruled spiral-bound notebooks, and composition notebooks (not spiral). You can also order online, and supplies will be shipped directly to Jackson Elementary. Just go to vougivegoods.com/colsupplydrive.

We pray that God blesses our efforts and uses our support to help the children at Jackson Elementary have success in learning this year!
