Are You Ready to "Do Lent?"

By the time you read this article.....Ash Wednesday will have already kicked off our 40 day journey into the season of Lent. Pastors have been planning, the Worship Coordinator has been working out the music, the theme and bulletin covers have been chosen. Choirs have been scheduled and groups have been chosen to put on the meals in between services. Parents have adjusted schedules and rides have been worked out.

Resetting our Focus

Sometimes, though, we are tempted to simply go into "Lenten mode" and reduce the season to "cramming everything in" and "filling in all the blanks" of what needs to be done and when so that the end of those 40 days brings a feeling of relief more than anything else. The satisfaction comes from knowing that the planning and schedule adjusting and coordinating are finally over for another year.

But that's not what Lent is.

Of course, the world we live in doesn't really do Lent so well, either. Have you ever googled the word "lent" before? Most of the results focus on a little bit of the history of the season, but stress even more that Lent calls for you to give something up – your sacrifice for those 40 days. They will even give you suggestions of what you might want to give up. (Some of those items included social media, coffee, chocolate, throwing away 40 things in 40 days, soda pop, complaining, eating out.)

Please don't misunderstand. I'm sure that there are many, many Christians who make sacrifices during these 40 days with a heart of faith and Christian freedom (my dad still gives up meat on Good Friday for sure), but I'm convinced that there are so many more people who hear that it's now the Lenten season and immediately think about what they might give up this year as they "do Lent." If that's where our preparation and celebration of Lent begins....something's wrong.

It's an easy trap to fall in to, isn't it? We are people who "do Lent" with more practices, more sermons, more worship, more scheduling, more running around, more....more. We have so much more to do as we look forward to Lent and celebrate Lent, right?

Or do we?

Remember What You Did....and What He Did

I can remember a Pastor saying once, What do we do for Lent? The proper place to start is to ask, 'What did we do for Lent?'" I knew exactly what he meant. Let me explain by telling you a story. My first congregation in Midland, MI had a parochial school. I made rounds to the classrooms during the week to say hi to the kids and build a rapport with them. One day I stopped by and the lower grade classroom was just about to start an art project. The kids begged me to stay and do the project with them.

To be sure, art is not my thing. I appreciate art and admire it – but I struggle with doing/making art for myself. Let's face it....I struggle even with the simple projects that feature popsicle sticks. But it's for the kids, right? I had some time, so I said yes and agreed to join in the fun.

The project? Making an elaborate cross....made out of popsicle sticks. Ugh. But as I sat there and arranged pieces and glued things together, it dawned on me....this is not the first cross I've ever made. As I stared at popsicle sticks that really didn't look right in the design I had made, and as I saw glue oozing

out of all the wrong places, I knew that I'd certainly been a part of making a cross already. It wasn't a cross that I had seen, but rather one that I had caused. None of my sins were glued to it. Rather, they were nailed to it. You've guessed it by now. It was the original cross of my Savior, Jesus Christ, who dutifully and lovingly put one pain-filled foot in front of the other and carried that cross all the way to the top of a hill. And there he allowed himself to be crucified for my sin and guilt, until it was paid for in full. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. (1 Peter 2:24)

So, what's the best way to go through Lent? Actually, we already did it...because we caused it. And really that's where a proper Lenten journey begins. Why go through a season Lent, filled with somber hymns and black banners and paraments? It's a way to commemorate how God's own Son came in grace and mercy to pay a price that we could never hope to pay. Lent is about what we did and continue to do as sinners. And it's about what Jesus did for us (we who never had a chance of salvation on our own).

So as we continue our journey through Lent, come to worship and marvel that there is actually nothing left for us to do, nothing that we have to pay for our forgiveness. Come with a repentant and contrite heart to receive God's gift of forgiveness. Be amazed at how deep and vast and wide our Savior's love really was for us.

One Pastor put it this way: Receive. Reflect. Be comforted. Soak in the Passion History as it's read. Come ready to hear the old, old story that gives us so much peace. Sing about it. Marvel at it. Come early to meditate a bit. Enjoy some food and time with fellow Christian pilgrims. Rejoice that God loved you enough to do it all to win your salvation.

With the Lord filling your heart and mind with the right perspective for this Lenten season, perhaps you can make a sacrifice to help you concentrate on the cross. After all, perhaps you really could stand to go without your coffee and soda pop for a while. And that social media.
